I am instructed by the High Commissioner to state to you that Her Majesty's Movernment have received with great regret the peremptory demands of the Government of the South African Republic conveyed to me in your Note of the 9th instant, and I am to inform you in reply that the conditions demanded by the Government of the South African Republic are such as Her Majesty's Government deem it impossible to discuss.
