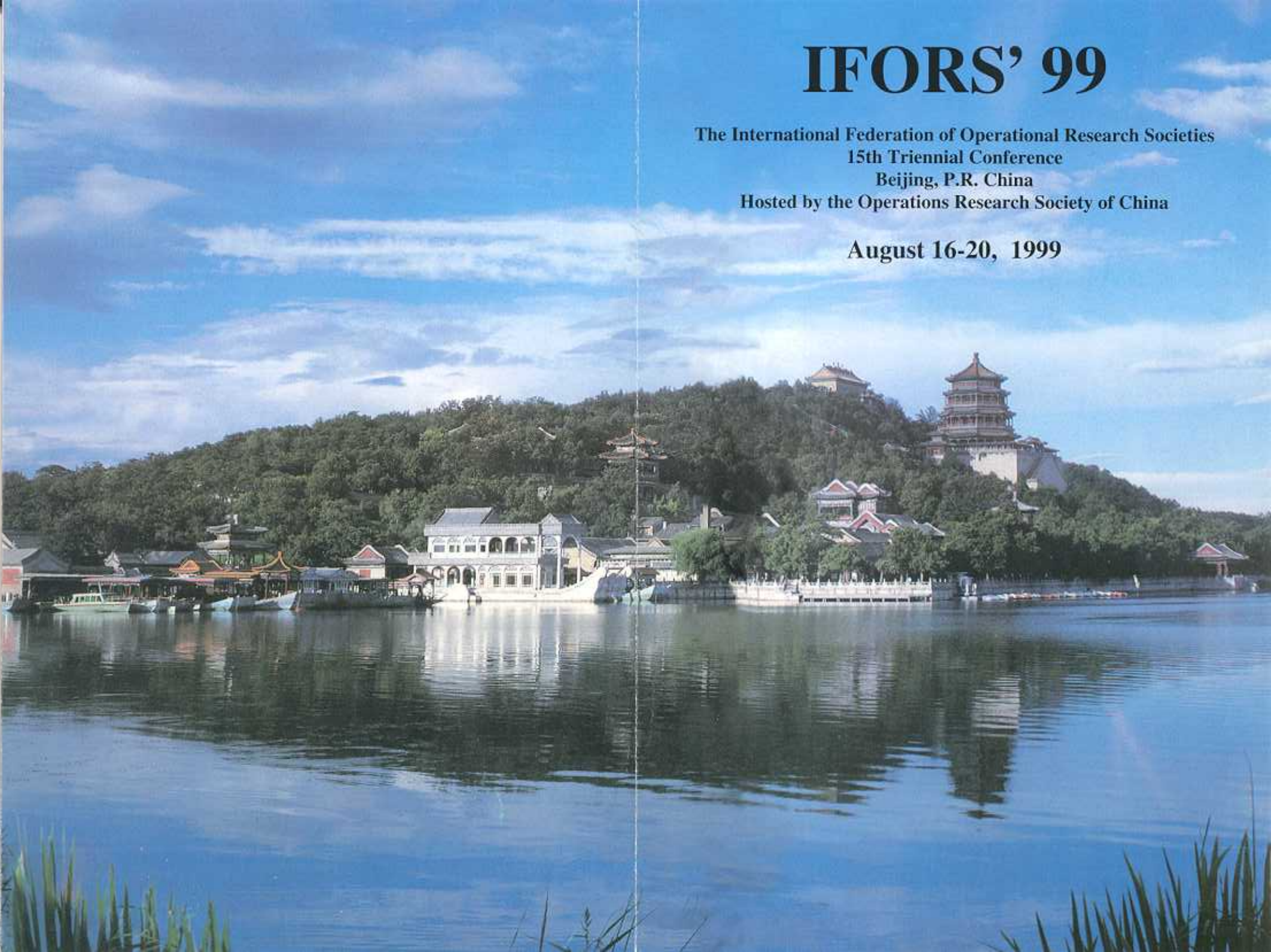

Invitation

The 1999 conference of the International Federation of Operational Research Societies (IFORS) will be held in Beijing, P.R.China. Beijing is a historical city which is quickly developing into a modern metropolitan city, and is well known for its gems of ancient Eastern civilization and its colorful modern activities. The Great Wall, the Forbidden City, the Temple of Heaven, and the Summer Palace are some of the many sights for you to see during the conference.

Conference Theme: OR -- Parallel roads to prosperity in the 21st Century

Conference venue and date

The conference will be held on **August 16–20, 1999** at the Friendship Hotel, one of the largest garden-style hotels in Asia.

Invited papers

Papers will be invited from prominent researchers and practitioners by session organizers. In addition, the national and kindred member societies of IFORS are invited to present National Contributions.

Contributed papers

Authors wishing to contribute papers are requested to submit an abstract of not more than 50 words electronically by WWW, or e-mail, or by fax or normal mail (see further details in the Abstract submission instructions section).

Publications

Abstracts of all papers to be presented to the conference will be published in advance of the conference. Several issues of *International Transactions in Operational Research (ITOR)* Volume 7, have been reserved for publication of papers presented to the conference. Professor Theo Stewart will serve as Guest Editor and arrange reviewing for all submitted articles. Authors are encouraged to prepare full papers for submission to this journal. The deadline for submission is **May 31, 1999**. A subscription for Volume 7 of *ITOR* in six issues will be provided to each conference registrant as part of the registration package.

Software and book exhibition

Commercial exhibitors are welcome to display books, journals and computer software related to OR. Potential exhibitors should contact the local organizing committee.

Further information

The Invitation Program will be mailed during the winter of 1998/99 to all who sent an Abstract Submission to the IFORS Secretariat, or sent a request for information to the IFORS'99 Conference Secretariat. The Invitation Program will contain information about plenary speakers, invited sessions as well as tutorials and scientific activities. The Invitation Program will also contain information about accommodation, cost of living, pre and post-conference tours and social activities.

IFORS: OR in development prize

IFORS is pleased to continue the tradition of the OR in Development Prize with a first prize of US \$2000 and additional prizes of US \$1000. Entries in the competition must meet the following criteria:

1. Papers should describe a practical application of OR in a developing country, which was conducted for a specific organization, in which the intention on both sides was to assist the decision-making process.
2. Principal authors and presenters should be nationals of a developing country.
3. Papers should be publishable in ITOR with at most minor revisions and should describe an application of OR which has original features, whether in methodology, application, or implementation.
4. Papers should include some description of the social context of the application, and the impact of the work on the decision-making process or on the organization in which the work took place. Where appropriate, the relevance of a country's state of development to the conduct of the study should be addressed. An emphasis on developmental issues will be a positive factor.

The abstracts should be in English, and should not include any mathematical notation. Each submission must contain all the following:

1. Paper title.
2. Abstract (maximum 50 words).
3. Author(s) name(s), Organization, and full mailing address, with the indication of the presenter.
4. An indication of the topic numbers (at most three) chosen from the Conference Topics List (see below) or suggestions for additional topics.

5. Abstracts fee: An abstract fee of US \$100.00 is required for all papers, both invited and contributed, (including National Contributions) and can be paid by either e-mail or ordinary mail. Payment may be made by Visa credit card, or by check payable to "IFORS". The abstract fee, which is non-refundable after **December 31, 1998**, will be credited towards the presenter's registration fee.

Electronic submission:

The deadline for the electronic submission of abstracts is **December 31, 1998**.
